

Tour 8 - Antiquing and Bargain Hunting

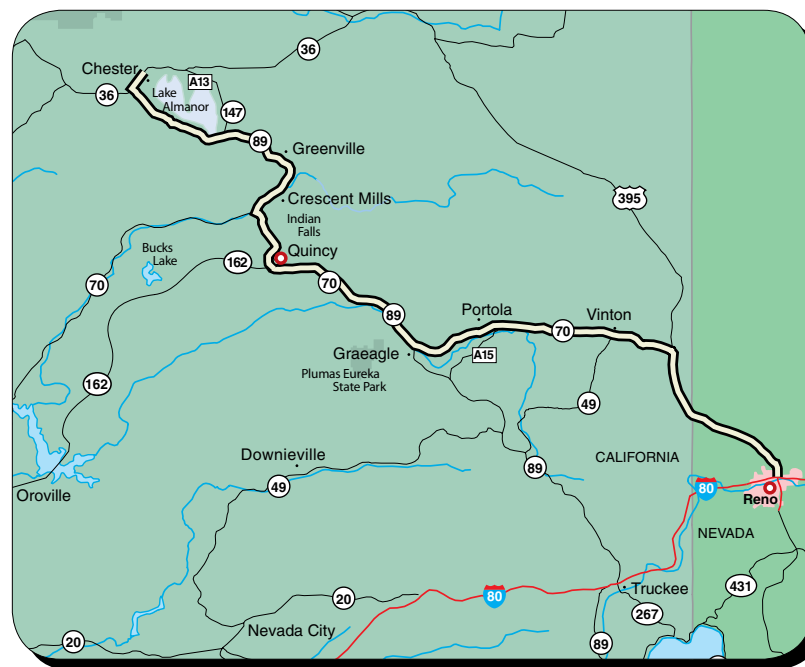


Shoppers in downtown Quincy can browse consignment and thrift stores.

Hunt quaint shops for bargains or antiques on a three-day spree and sightseeing tour of Plumas County's small mountain communities.

Off-season (October - May) in Plumas County is the perfect time to explore small mountain communities and their quaint antique and thrift shops, several of which are housed in historic buildings. Many restaurants, motels, bed and breakfast inns and small museums are open year-round. Local newspapers list yard sales, rummage sales, estate sales, liquidation sales, moving sales, and flea markets where buyers can find a variety of antiques and treasures at bargain prices. At this scenic time of year there are fewer visitors, making Plumas County the ideal location for a memorable getaway surrounded by spectacular scenery.

Day 1 - Reno to Quincy

 From Reno to Quincy is 80 miles, allow 90 minutes driving time.

From Reno, follow U.S. 395 north 24 miles to the intersection of Hwy. 70 at Hallelujah Junction. Turn west and take Hwy. 70 25 miles through Beckwourth to Portola.

The antique and thrift shops in Plumas County are often open on weekends and some weekdays. Contact the shops to confirm their off-season hours prior to your visit.

All the libraries offer used books, tapes and videos for sale at bargain prices on their Friends of the Library display shelves.

Shopping in Quincy - W. Main St. and adjacent side streets, Plumas Pines Shopping Center at Hwy. 70 and Quincy Junction Rd. and East Quincy along Hwy. 70. Art galleries, antique and thrift shops, gift shops, and stores selling books, clothing, candy, toys and more are located along this route.
